

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The acts of Jesus in the Gospel of Mark 1:29-39 make the kingdom of God evident and perceptible. It begins, after teaching at the synagogue, Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John, Immediately others from the household tell Jesus Simon's mother-in-law is in bed sick with a fever. Jesus grasped her hand helping her to stand. The fever left her, and she served them. After sunset, the ill and demon possessed are brought to Jesus; the whole town gathered at the door for there was no one that had not been adversely affected by sin and in need of restoration to God. Jesus cures many sick and afflicted by demons; he forbade the demons to speak because they would reveal his identity at this crucial moment in the wrong way. Rising before dawn Jesus went to a deserted place to pray. Simon and those with him pursued Jesus and said, "Everyone is looking for you." Instead of returning to the same town Jesus visited other nearby villages to spread the Good News. Jesus' purpose was to reach as many as possible. He went into their synagogues, preached, and drove out demons throughout the whole of Galilee. Matthew 8:17 says it was all done to fulfil what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah, "He took our infirmities and bore our diseases."

Every healing and deliverance happened because Jesus was then and is now the sacrifice for our sins that makes us whole (ls. 53:4-5). These divine manifestations happen in our lives today and are evidence of God that draw others to Christ. How many of us have been healed through prayer, receiving the Eucharist, the Anointing of the Sick, or set free from our old habits and lifestyles? It is a great mercy to tell others by whom we were healed and how to find Him. The people in today's gospel and Jesus inspire us. The household of Simon and Andrew do not try to handle things on their own but immediately come to Jesus. After being healed Simon's mother-in-law serves Jesus and others! The Sacraments lead us more deeply into service. Jesus spends most of his time preaching and healing, but it is important to note he had to spend time alone in prayer. Only then did he have the strength to fulfil his purpose and give the people that flocked to him the help they needed. Our days can be very demanding and there is much evil to resist. Scripture says we can do all things through Christ who strengthens us (Phil 4:13). Do you have the strength you need? - Diana Nussberger



Prayer for Vocations





Anointing of the Sick Blessing of Caregivers Petitions to Our Lady of Lourdes


